GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS OF SAN DIEGO CITY SCHOOLS

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

1. Character--A record of responsible citizenship. This is a very important requirement, and will be interpreted firmly.
2. Attendance--Six semesters of regular attendance in senior high school for six periods daily.
3. Physical Education or R.O.T.C. each semester enrolled.
4. Credits--A total of 40 semester credits (in 9-12 inclusive), including a maximum of 8 semester credits earned in physical education, 30 of which must be earned in 10th, 11th, and 12th grades. These must include:
 - A. English--six semesters. Regular 10th and 11th grade English and two semesters of elective English or Speech Arts.
 - B. Social Studies--Six semesters--Basic Citizenship, a course required of all tenth graders. State Mandate Units (Driver Education, Alcohol and Narcotics Education) are studied during the first semester. Civics, Economics and World History are offered during the second semester. Students with a "B" average may substitute World History or Biology, if the Mandated Units are taken in Summer School.

U. S. History is required of all 11th grade students.

American Government and Problems (Senior Problems) is required of all 12th grade students. It is usually a one semester course, but it will be a year course at Crawford High School.
 - C. Science--two semester credits (including credits earned in 9th grade)
 - D. Mathematics--two semester credits (including credits earned in 9th grade)
 - E. Fine Arts--one semester credit (including credit earned in 9th grade)
 - F. Homemaking for Girls--two semester credits (including 9th grade)
 - G. Industrial Arts for Boys--two semester credits (including 9th grade)
 - H. A Specialized or Major Interest is recommended. This should include at least six semester credits, including those earned in the 9th grade, in an approved pattern, in one of the following fields: Speech Arts, Science, Mathematics, Social Studies, Foreign Language, Business Education, Homemaking, Industrial Arts, Art and Music.
 - I. Twelfth grade English Review and Twelfth Grade Arithmetic Review--one semester credit will be required in 12th grade English Review and one semester credit will be required in 12th grade Math Review of all students who fail to pass a standard test in these subjects in the 11th grade.
